Autism West Midlands is co-organising the first Autism Show in Birmingham. The show will be held on 19 and 20 June at the NEC Birmingham. It's packed with informative talks, interactive features and specialist products and services.

Talks include: 'How GP's should support people with autism and their carers and families', 'Transforming care for autism and learning disabilities', and 'Social and personal relationships for people on the autism spectrum'. There will also be chances for adults on the spectrum to talk about their life experiences and visitors can listen to a wealth of practical strategies and approaches. There will also be free one-to-one specialist clinics that offer visitors immediate access to experienced advisers, clinicians, therapists and solicitors on subjects such as how to get a diagnosis and what happens next, challenging behaviour, legal advice on special educational needs, supporting your child at school, welfare rights, wills and trusts, and support packages for young adults and legal entitlements post 16.
