

We make every effort to include your child in all school activities

We are an inclusive school and we make every effort to make sure that all students take part fully in the life of the school. This includes school trips, residential events, school productions and social events.

We never exclude a student from a school trip as a sanction for bad behaviour. The only occasion when a student would not be included in a trip or event would be when taking them off site would pose a threat to the students' or the public's safety. In these very rare occasions an alternative activity on site is arranged for the student.

We actively promote opportunities for students to access activities with other schools. Regularly the students take part in local and regional sporting competitions. They also take part in quizzes and last year a team from Baskerville School represented the region in a National Consumer competition.

Where a student is particularly able in a subject that we cannot provide, we try and find where he or she can access the course in a local school with Baskerville staff in support. For more practical students of higher ability, we may also try to find a bridging course in areas such as construction or engineering.

We run a range of clubs to enrich students' social experiences and develop leisure interests. There are two after school clubs and a range of lunchtime activities. Thursdays are 'no computer days' where during break times all students follow an activity of their choice that does not involve operating a computer, tablet or electronic game. This is to ensure that all students participate in an active pastime and interact with peers at least once a week.

The school was originally built for students many of whom were wheel chair users and so the majority of classes are on the ground floor. Similarly, there is some ground floor residential provision. The school has an accessibility strategy plan that identifies how further improvements can be made as and when building work is undertaken.
